



#### THE HOUSE THAT WAS

It happens that this story is about a house that could see every day from my living room window that faced north.

This house had some special significance in the past. It had sold recently. One day it completely disappeared. An excavator came and demolished it. The remains were trucked away and at the moment it is an empty lot.

According to locals this same house had been Marleau's Shoe Repair. In 1926 it was bought by Richard (Dick) du Manoir who was married to Maggie Deschamps. Dick's father living in France had the title of Count du Manoir Juaye du Manoir. On the death of his father in 1929, Dick and Maggie inherited the title of the Count and Countess Du Manoir. Instead of resuming a life of privilege in France, they decided to stay in Westmeath. Dick had built a small store beside his house which sold paint and hardware. Dick had talents not only as the village's decorator but a pianist as well. He died at the age of 73. Afterwards the paint store was demolished.

Prior to the advent of automobiles, the busy downtown, the lower side of the bridge running through the center of it, was the hub of businesses and activity.

As well as Marleau's Shoe Repair, the was Kilgore's Harness Shop, Carlson's Tailor Shop, Conroy's Butcher Shop, Cecile's Hotel and Reid's General Store, as well as a couple of Blacksmith business's. Dr. ET Woods, well known for custom medicines, had an office on the other side of the bridge.

Conroy's Store later became Kenny's Store, Brian and June Kenny resided in in the house beside it, formerly Cecile's Hotel.

At this time there was continuation school or high school at the Westmeath Public School. Some of the high school girls saved tobacco from cigarette butts until they enough to get out of sight below the bridge and enjoy a smoke..
