

### WDRA UPDATE

In the past four weeks there has been much activity involving the Community Hall that hasn't been shared with its users, which is stretching their patience and for which the committee apologizes for. There are explanations also for the delays:

Hall Entrance way Demolition: The start date of the contract of August 19th was not begun for various reasons. It was awarded to the winning bidder only a few days before the go-ahead date. The WDRA, the project manager and the bid winner (Wade Construction of Petawawa) wanted every detail of the design to be accurate. Bond insurance for the contractor then took a couple weeks to obtain. It may take more time before we see demolition of the entrance way. Our contractor plans to begin shortly but wants every piece of equipment required on hand to do a quick and thorough job. Meanwhile the contractor has longer lead-time materials on order and welding of some sub-assemblies are being worked on in their shop.

The contractor is still scheduled to complete the project by year-end, BUT will do everything possible they can to have at least the entrance into the hall available by November 21st so that our usual Christmas time and New Years Eve events can proceed. Remember, this goal of a new entrance began in the year 2000, 19 years ago. If we waited that long, surely a few months of impatience will be worth it to have not only a new entrance, but also a barrier-free ramp and both covered by an overhead roof.

<u>Hall Floor</u>: The floors were heavily used during the past flood in April when it became an emergency response center and definitely showed the wear and tear. Plans were made to have it sanded down and coated. To give it special appearance, it was buffed and varnished afterwards. No access to the Hall was inconvenient for some, and again we apologize for that.

<u>Fittings for 200 chair-legs</u>: The current fixtures on the 800 chair-legs, in use for over 10 years, are wearing out and scratching the floor finish. A search has been ongoing for months to find appropriate replacements and just this week Mel has found ones to do the job. Timing is excellent because all the chairs are off the floor and will only be put onto the floor once the protected bottoms are placed on them.

<u>Halls Windows</u>: They will be replaced with new modern ones by Valley Window and Door in early October, before the Hall reopens later on in November.

We would like to let everyone know that the hall can be used with limited use during the renovation and for those inquiring you should check with our hall booker Marg Gervais, to confirm if it might be used for any specific activity during the renovations.

We wish to acknowledge all the volunteer work and thousands of hours that has been donated since 2000 to make this ramp happen. Special thanks go out to Dave Lessard for getting the survey, Graham Desjardins for welding the temporary ramp and Ian Johnson of Jp2g who is our Project Manager and who also donated much of his own time in the design and development of this amazing project.
